16 July at 4pm- Readings from the poetry of David Jones accompanied by harp music from Wales at Llansantffraed church-details already circulated, but a reminder will be issued nearer the time;

August (dates to be confirmed)- print workshops led by Ruth Lloyd, Ruth Gibbs, Jamie Tobin, Kath Littler and Bettina Reeves;

7 October- all day study day at y Gaer- details to follow in due course;

31 October David Jones exhibition closes but the accompanying Llanthony exhibition in the permanent gallery will remain open until mid November.

We look forward to seeing Society members at the events and of course the exhibitions.
