#### Brecon Cathedral Tower Tours - 10.00am & 11.00am




We look forward to welcoming you to the Cathedral to view Brecon and the beautiful scenery from the Cathedral Tower. Climbing the tower is well worth the effort for the wonderful views of the Brecon Beacons National Park, the inside of the Cathedral and the bells. Climbing to the roof is an adventure – not just a simple spiral staircase.

Booking has to be made through the Cathedral Office. Tel: 01874 623857 or email: admin@breconcathedral.org.uk There will be a charge of £5 per head. There is a visitors car park and disabled access to the Cathedral. Pilgrims Restaurant is in the Cathedral Close and can be contacted on 01874 610610 or pilgrimstearooms@gmail.com for refreshments. Notes: The tower was not built for tourists and photographers; There is only one way up and down. Steps are steep and small. Passages are low and narrow. All people over 5 feet tall must wear a hard hat. Sensible shoes must be worn (the steps may be dusty and the duckboards on the roof may be slippery). No child under the age of 8 is allowed to climb the tower. Each child aged 8-15 must be accompanied by an adult. Climbs are not permitted in heavy rain, strong winds or when the temperature is below freezing. If you have been diagnosed with heart or lung illnesses you are strongly advised NOT to attempt the tower tour as the climb is physically demanding which could potentially place you at risk.

### Monday 11 September

#### St. David's Church, Llanddew



**Open Church and Exhibition** 10.30 am - 3.30 pm: The church in Llanddew is the oldest church in Breconshire, dating from the 13th century.

There will be an exhibition and sale of work by the members of Llanddew Craft Group in the church.

Bishop Gower's Well is in the

village and there are some ruins from the bishop's palace. The palace was the residence of Giraldus Cambrensis, Gerald of Wales. There will be a cake stall; and tea/coffee and refreshments will be available. Disabled access; toilets and car parking at the Village Hall, a short distance from the Church. For those feeling energetic, there is a walk from Brecon Cathedral to Llanddew through Priory Groves alongside the River Honddu - it's about 4 miles (there and back) but includes a steep climb up to the village.

## **Treholford House and Gardens**

11am to 3pm. Free entry to house and gardens.



A rare opportunity to see a hidden gem. Treholford House has been owned by the Blackham family since 1948, formerly part of the Buckland Estate. It is thought to be the Dower House of the Gwynne Holford family. The Buckland estate extended to around 30,000 acres at its peak before it was sold off after the death of

J.P.W. Gwynne Holford in 1919. The Holford family also owned Westonbirt in Gloucestershire, now the home of the National Arboretum. Specimen trees from there were brought to Treholford at the same time as the Regency remodelling of the house was taking place in 1837

Now an estate in its own right of 3000 acres, Treholford encompasses Llangors Lake, Blaenllynfi castle, agricultural and forestry land. It is listed as "a fine late C18 and earlyC19 country house...with strong connections with county estate owning families. There are beautiful views of the lake, landscaped grounds and a listed and complete early C19 walled garden. The house retains many of its original fixtures and fittings.

Cake and refreshments on sale with all proceeds going to support volunteer work at Blaenllynfi Castle under the direction of Cadw.

Directions; A40 to Bwlch. At the war monument take the B4560 to Llangors. Drive for one mile to Cathedine. Turn right into narrow lane for parking and house. Limited disabled parking at house.

Sloping paths and grounds. Reasonable access to most areas.

# Church Monuments Society Informal study day at Brecon



Brecon Cathedral (formerly the parish church, and before that the Priory of St John) is ledgerstone heaven. Restoration by Scott in the 1860s and 1870s saved an outstanding collection of early modern floor slabs including about 60 of the characteristic Welsh cross slabs. The cathedral also has medieval cross slabs and effigy tombs.

This study day begins with lectures in Christ College, Brecon, on the site of a medieval Dominican friary. Talks will explore the rich heritage of commemorative verse in Welsh and the survival of the traditional cross slab in sixteenth-

and seventeenth-century Wales.

There will be an opportunity to visit the College chapel to look at medieval and postmedieval tombs and some remarkable misericords. After lunch (not included – Brecon has a range of restaurants, pubs and cafés) we reconvene at the Cathedral to explore its collection of tomb carvings.

For those who want to make a weekend of it, on Sunday we will offer a self-driven tour of some more local churches: a chance to explore the gorgeous painted wall monuments of the Brute family of stonemasons with their gilded cherubs and swags of fruit and flowers.

The charge for the day is  $\pounds$ 17.50 members,  $\pounds$ 22.50 non-members. This includes admission to the College chapel, tea and coffee on arrival but not lunch. There is no additional charge for the Sunday.

The construction work at the new Archive facility at Unit 29, Ddole Road Industrial Estate in Llandrindod has now been completed and the new mobile shelving has also been installed. It has taken around six weeks for the contractor to install the shelving in both stores, which reaches just under five metres high. In total it can accommodate 14,954 linear metres of records.

At the beginning of June the removal company started to move all of the records from temporary storage into the new facility. This has now been completed and the records from the Archive building at County Hall are now being relocated, along with the furniture and other equipment. Our public searchroom will reopen in our new facility on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> August. 

#### Sibanye, Brecon welcomes the Zulus

The Anglo-Zulu War took place in 1879, provoked by the British invasion of Zululand as part of a plan to create a confederated state in southern Africa. The British were led by Lord Chelmsford who seriously underestimated the skill and prowess of the Zulus. His forces were caught unprepared at Isandlwana where the Zulus won a famous victory. A few survivors fled to Rorke's Drift to warn the mission where a heroic defence took place. The main regiment involved at Isandlwana and Rorke's Drift was the 24th whose headquarters were in Brecon. Nowadays, the Regimental Museum of the Royal Welsh in Brecon is the proud protector of many VCs awarded to the soldiers of the 24th, and contains a display room dedicated to artefacts from the Zulu War.

The Friends of the Regimental Museum were established to provide support to the Museum; they carry this out through fund raising and running projects which fit with the museum's objectives. Their current project is Never Forget Your Welsh Heroes (NFYWH), which digitises letters and diaries of Welsh soldiers. In 2016. NFYWH came to the attention of parties in KwaZulu-Natal who had an interest in commemorating the bravery of warriors from both sides in the Anglo-Zulu War and in the shared historical heritage of Zululand and Wales. Initial contacts resulted in a visit by the South African High Commissioner to Brecon in November 2016. The Friends established a project team which was invited to visit KwaZulu-Natal in January 2017 where they attended the annual re-enactment at Isandlwana and were warmly welcomed by King Goodwill Zwelithini.

Out of these visits and meetings, a project was established, called Sibanye, meaning "we are one", to show that the way forward for these past adversaries is to acknowledge the events of the past but to move on in a spirit of support and co-operation. Our prime focus will be on the next generation so that they have a greater understanding of the past to inform a better future. The Sibanye project will be split into sub-projects, each with a different annual theme. We plan to focus on heritage aspects in 2017 to get the project off to a high profile start. Further themes are

- Agriculture
- Education
- Arts and culture
- Sport
- Business

We will be welcoming 80 Zulus to Brecon in August. It will be a wonderful opportunity to meet some of the descendants of the Zulu warriors who fought at Isandlwana and Rorke's Drift. We will be presenting a variety of events for all the family, please come and support this unique occasion.
