5.30pm The launch of a new book The Llanthony Valley: A Borderland by Oliver Fairclough

This book explores the valley, and especially its landscape, people and buildings, through probate records, estate archives, maps, newspaper reports and personal accounts. Its catalyst was the recent restoration by the Landmark Trust of Llwyn Celyn, a farmhouse dating back to 1420. The event starts at 5.30 pm onwards (light refreshments); this followed at 7.00 pm by the AGM of the History Group (free) and at 7.30 pm by an illustrated talk by Caroline Stanford 'Llwyn Celyn: The Full Story' (visitor admission £4.00). Mari Fforde will be leading a project to build a book throne. Come along to help, dress up and be photographed as your favourite Hay character sitting on the throne.


Pop-up Museum 10.00am - 4.00pm

We will have displays on some of the amazing people who have been central to the history of Hay. These include Matilda de Braose, the Agincourt Archers, Rev. Francis Kilvert, Archdeacon William Bevan, Alfred Savigar, Doctors of Hay, Hincks family, Agnes de Winton, Richard Booth and many more.

Up Top - From Lunatic Asylum to Community Care - an Illustrated talk by Hugh Purcell 4.00 pm



Up Top tells how the mentally ill were treated in the 20th century, focusing on the Mid Wales Mental Hospital, which began as a lunatic asylum and closed when community care took over 100 years later. It was the only UK hospital for psychotic POWs in World War II, including, briefly, the Deputy Führer Rudolf Hess.

All events are at Hay Parish Hall, Lion Street.

Monday 1 October

St David's Church, Llanddew LD3 9SS



Open Church and Exhibition 10.30 am - 3.30 pm

The church in Llanddew is the oldest church in Breconshire, dating from the 13th century. Bishop Gower's double-sided well is in the village and some ruins from the bishop's palace are visible from the road. The palace was the residence of Giraldus

Cambrensis (Gerald of Wales) while he was Archdeacon at Brecon Cathedral. Further information about the history of the church, and about Giraldus Cambrensis, is available in the church. There will be an exhibition and sale of work by the members of Llanddew Craft Group. There will be a cake stall; and tea/coffee and refreshments will be available. Disabled access to the church; parking and toilets are available at the Village Hall, which is a short distance from the church.

For those feeling energetic, there is a walk from Brecon Cathedral to Llanddew through Priory Groves. It is about 4 miles round trip, and includes a steep climb up a lane to the village.

The Somerset Family in South Wales a talk by Dr Ann Benson. 7.00pm

Elizabeth Herbert's marriage in 1492 to Sir Charles Somerset is of major significance for Breconshire as their descendants, successively earls of Worcester and from 1682, dukes of Beaufort, held significant roles at local and national levels for four centuries, during which time Raglan Castle, Troy House and Llangattock Park were their principal Welsh homes. This richly illustrated talk traces the history of the family and their three Welsh homes.

Exhibitions

August - October

Llanwrtyd Heritage and Arts Centre



Thursday - Sunday: 10.00am - 4.00pm

From the 6th August the Llanwrtyd and District Heritage and Arts Centre will have a new display celebrating the 150th Anniversary of the completion of the Heart of Wales Railway line. The line was opened to through traffic on 8th October 1868 following the completion of the Cynghordy viaduct and Sugar Loaf tunnel (referred

to in a recent Hanes article on "The Coming of the Railway").

Building on the permanent exhibition in the Centre, this new display provides additional details and photographs illustrating the development of the line and its significance to the town and the surrounding area. Whilst its original purpose was to link the industrial areas of England and South Wales it had far more importance for the development of the local towns as tourist destinations. The late 19th and early 20th Century saw thousands of visitors coming to "take the waters" and benefit from pursuits in the surrounding countryside promoting "health and vigour". This is the second special display at the Centre this season, with an exhibition commemorating the end of WW1 already attracting many visitors.

September

Breconshire Local & Family History Society



There will be an exhibition in Brecon Library based on the "People of Breconshire" Theme. The highlight of the exhibition will be a display of information about the life and work of Dr Mary Elizabeth "Eppynt" Phillips [1874-1956]. Born in Brecon, she was the first female Doctor of Medicine to receive her initial training in Cardiff. She was a Suffragist and had a distinguished War career with the Scottish Women's Hospital for Foreign Service, in Belgium, Malta and Serbia. The exhibition will be on show for the whole of the month of September.

As summer stretches its wide warm arms across the Black Mountains we have been making speedy progress at Llwyn Celyn. Completion is now in sight. The last of our volunteer weeks in early June saw a small group of repeat volunteers returning to help with the interpretation displays. Everyone from contractors to visitors seems to have found an interesting piece of rusting iron, a glass bottle or an eye catching shard of pottery. How to display these items safely and permanently in the Beast House is a bit of a challenge and we have been aided by local artists Matt and Amanda Caines who have cast their trained eves over all the items and their arrangement.

There is still lots of work to be done in the Threshing Barn to make it suitable for community use, but the old medieval hall house is now being furnished and fitted out with a kitchen. The final result will remain a secret until the grand unveiling in the autumn. We are delighted to announce that public open days will be held at Llwyn Celvn from 10am-4pm on Sunday 7th to Wednesday 10th October. The whole site will be open and free to visit. If you represent a group who would wish to visit, we are hosting group tours on 8th-10th October to help keep numbers manageable on Sunday. Hay Castle Restoration Work Has Begun



The work to repair and restore Hay Castle has begun! The appointed contractor, John Weaver Conservation, arrived on site and commenced works on 4th June 2018. John Weaver Conservation will work with Hav Castle Trust and Rick Mather Architects on the project, which will result in an important centre for the arts and learning and a valuable community asset.



For a thousand years, this remarkable structure has been part of the landscape. Part Norman, part Jacobean and part Victorian, Hay Castle has been a home to invaders, patriots' citadel, country manor and a world-famous bookshop. Building on this creative tradition, Hay Castle is about to take on a new life — as a major centre for culture, arts and education.
